### SeniorCare made it possible for Anne to come home

"The support and encouragement of SeniorCare has made it possible for my mother to be cared for at home and receive the quality of care I believe she deserves. She has been thriving, physically and emotionally, with



the care and attention she has received. This has provided me with a great deal of peace, which I did not have when she was in a nursing home. It has also made it possible for me to continue to be self-employed." SeniorCare Care Manager Annemarie Beauparlant recently heard this good news from the daughter of a SeniorCare consumer, Anne Hyatt.

Anne was a bookkeeper and secretary for many years. She lives with her daughter, Wendy, who runs a child day care center out of their split-level home. Six years ago, Anne was diagnosed with dementia. In 2010, daughter Wendy noticed that Anne's disease was progressing, so she called upon SeniorCare for help. Anne received services from SeniorCare, both at home and at an adult day care center. The goal was always to help Anne stay at home where she wanted to be.

In December of 2011, Anne had a setback and her advanced dementia caused her to become unable to feed herself. That meant she could no longer go the adult day care center, and all her care needed to be available at home. After a hospital stay for medication management, she was referred to a nursing facility.

## MEALS ON WHEELS SAVE LIVES

Every home delivered Meals on Wheels meal delivered in Beverly, Essex, Gloucester, Hamilton, Ipswich, Manchester-by-the-Sea, Rockport, Topsfield, and Wenham is provided or funded by SeniorCare Inc. Monday through Friday, a dedicated corps of SeniorCare volunteer drivers and staff deliver more than 525 nutritious meals to homebound people 60+. A voluntary, confidential donation of \$2 per meal is requested, but Meals on Wheels are not based on income, and no one is ever denied a meal because they cannot make a donation.

Recently, a couple from one of SeniorCare's communities sent a very generous donation with the words that without Meals on Wheels they might have "starved to death."

Autumn is the time to prepare for winter days when getting out can be difficult. In early November, SeniorCare's Nutrition Department distributes shelf stable emergency meals to homebound elders at particular risk or to those who request them. The meals can be used when regular Meals on Wheels service is disrupted due to weather or other conditions. All elders served by the Nutrition Department are encouraged to set up a storm shelf with staple food and basic supplies. Storm shelf suggestions will be sent to all SeniorCare meals participants. ## SENIORCARE DRUG DISCOUNT CARD

SeniorCare provides a Drug Discount Card in partnership with Needy Meds. The free Card may save you 80% or more on the cost of prescription medicines, over-the-counter drugs, and even prescription drugs for pets if filled at participating pharmacies and stores. The card is available regardless of age or income.

The SeniorCare Drug Discount Card is accepted at over 70,000 pharmacies, including major chains such as Walmart, CVS, Walgreens, Rite Aid, and at regional chains and local stores. The SeniorCare Drug Discount Card cannot be combined with insurance, is not an insurance plan or connected with any insurance plan. Individual card usage is not tracked and is completely confidential.




